Regarding [liveatc.net](http://www.liveatc.net) - they have live receivers for all sorts of things, including the actual HF frequencies for transatlantic flights. Also, if one looks at the pages for the various ARTCC locations, there is a breakdown of which airports fall under which Centers, along with frequencies and live links to their radio channels.

<https://www.liveatc.net/search/?icao=hf> will get the HF aero frequency page.

Placing any ICAO code after that equals sign will get you the page for that Center or airport.

ZBW Boston Center

ZNY New York Center

KJFK Kennedy Airport

etc.

I have not found a way to get to New York's handoff frequency for HF that is as easy as the one for Gander. If you know a frequency, then you can put it into the frequency search box and it will take you to a live link if one exists. I think the easiest way to find out what those transitional VHF channels are is to take note of them when Gander or New York gives them to incoming flights.

While poking around for NY's frequency, I happened across another page with tons of detail about all of the HF aero control centers. It has locations of transmitters and frequency tables by MWARA and band, along with other info.
